3.6.1 Bids will only be considered if correctly completed and accompanied by all relevant certificates and other necessary applicable information.

### 3.7 COMPLETION OF SPECIFICATION

3.7.1 Where specifications are designed in such a way that responses would be required from bidders, these forms must be completed and submitted as part of the bid document.

### 3.8 CONDITIONS OF BID

- 3.8.1 The successful Contractor must be in a position to assume duty on the date stipulated in the letter of acceptance.

3.24.1 Bidders are to complete SBD 6.1 document where applicable. Failure by the bidder to submit a valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate will result in the bidder not being considered for preference points allocation. If the information required is not applicable to the business, clearly insert the symbols "N/A" in the appropriate space. If the space provided is left blank, it will be regarded as information that is still outstanding and the SBD 6.1 will not be processed further.

### 3.25 TERMINATION OF SERVICES

3.25.1 Should the Contractor fail to meet the conditions of this contract, or continue rendering unsatisfactory service, the Employer reserves the right to terminate the contract, after written notification has been served on the Contractor, with retention of the right to recover from the Contractor any losses which the Employer may suffer/ incur as a result of the failure, without prejudicing any other rights it may have.

### 3.26 TAX CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE

- 3.26.1 The central supplier database and the tax compliance status pin are the approved methods that will be utilised to verify Tax Clearance compliance.

### 3.27 UNSATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE

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### **PROJECT BRIEF**

THE APPOINTMENT OF SKILLED GOVERNANCE PROFESSIONALS TO CONSTITUTE A PANEL OF EXPERTS TO ASSIST MUNICIPALITIES ON TECHNICAL GOVERNANCE RELATED MATTERS, INCLUDING SUPPORTING MUNICIPALITIES PLACED UNDER CONSTITUTIONAL INTERVENTION.

### 1. OBJECTIVE

The Department of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs is to appoint panel of governance experts to assist municipalities on technical governance related matters, including supporting municipalities placed under constitutional intervention. The objective of this deployment is to appoint suitably skilled qualified governance professionals/companies who will be deployed to the municipality for a period agreed upon to provide hands on support to the municipality, act as Ministerial Representatives (where required), identify governance challenges and develop an implementation/recovery support plan to restore stability of the municipality.

### 2. BACKGROUND

The Department has a constitutional mandate to monitor and support municipalities. In keeping with its mandate, Department developed various programmes of support to municipalities. In specific cases, municipalities are assisted by the Department either through Constitutional Interventions or other Provincial Interventions. Municipalities placed under intervention are supported by an external resource with the development and implementation of a recovery plan. The recovery plan will address challenges experienced by the municipality; improve governance including systems, policies, oversight, capacity building, service delivery and financial management thus restoring political and administrative stability in the municipality in order that it may manage its own affairs.

### SUPPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT

Governance support to the Department will be utilized when required.

### 3. DETAILED SCOPE OF WORK

### Deployment methodology

The appointed skilled governance professional/s or service provider will be deployed to an identified municipality or municipalities as determined by the Department of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs in consultation with the client municipality or municipalities (where applicable).

The appointed service provider will be required to perform a scope of work from activities detailed below as a guideline. The scope of work may include developing and presenting an implementation/recovery support plan detailing tasks to be undertaken and key milestones and deliverables that will be achieved. The implementation support/recovery plan will be subject to approval by the Department and Municipal Council of the municipality concerned. Governance experts tendering to support the Department may be assigned duties in line with the Municipal Systems Act, Municipal Structures Act and any other applicable legislation or framework as identified by the Department.

# The established panel of expertise must have the following minimum competencies and expertise:

- Comprehensive knowledge and understanding of the legislation applicable to municipalities, including but not limited to the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa; Municipal Systems Act and Municipal Structures Act, MFMA, Municipal Property Rates Act and Intergovernmental Relations Framework Act;
- In the instance of support to the Department comprehensive knowledge and understanding of the legislation applicable to Provincial Government including but not limited to the PFMA;
- Regulations relevant to Municipalities or Provincial Government as the case may be;
- Knowledge and experience in the workings of the various governance systems used by municipalities including the processing and extracting of information;
- Ability to transfer skills to Provincial and Municipal officials; and
- A clear understanding of the dynamics of the KwaZulu-Natal Municipalities and the Provincial Government particularly the Department of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs.

### SCOPE OF WORK

- Support the corporate services administration in a manner that would enable the municipality to perform its functions;
- Provide training on roles and responsibilities to all councillors and senior officials;
- Assign appropriate and clear responsibilities, for the proper management and coordination of the administrative units, systems and mechanisms;

- Ensure the understanding, amongst officials and councillors, and the enforcement of Schedule 1 and 2 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act No. 32 of 2000, and assist the municipality to implement consequence management measures;
- Facilitate a culture of public service and accountability amongst the municipal staff;
- Assess the capacity and functionality of council committees/oversight structures in the municipality;
- Provide specific training to all Portfolio Committees, MPAC members and municipal senior officials, Ethics/Rules Committee, the Speaker and Council on all governance frameworks, including the Rules and Orders and the Code of Conduct for Councillors;
- Put in place tools/systems to improve the functionality of Council Committees including the monitoring and support;
- Provide guidance and hands-on support to the Portfolio Committees, the MPAC, the Council and any other committee as required;
- Monitor the implementation of Municipal Governance Frameworks, Policies and Bylaws within the municipality/municipalities on a monthly basis, including developing and implementing monitoring tool(s);
- Improve existing generic agendas for Council Committees;
- Support any investigation instituted in terms of section 106 of the Municipal Systems
   Act, including the implementation of findings in such reports, as required by the
   Ministerial Representative or the municipality as the case may be;
- Support the municipality in the drafting and enforcement of its municipal by-laws, including identifying required by-laws and shortcomings in implementation of current by-laws;

In municipalities under constitutional interventions, the service provider must also:

- Assume the Ministerial Representative position if so designated by the MEC or support the Ministerial Representative (if appointed in that capacity) by providing guidance and advice during council decision-making processes;
- Perform such responsibilities as may be assigned in writing by the appointing authority, for the proper management and coordination of administrative units, systems and mechanisms in the municipality;
- Prepare, facilitate adoption and implement strategic and operational actions identified in the recovery plan as well as emerging challenges.

### 4. TIME FRAMES

The Department will make use of the panel of experts as soon as it is appointed for a period of three years. The contract will be for a period determined by the Department through the advertisement of the appointment of the panel, which will be on a rotational basis as defined in the project brief accepted and signed by the appointed panellists. The Chief Director: Municipal Governance and Administration or any other such official duly designated will determine the duration of specific projects. The duration of the Ministerial Representative appointment is determined by the MEC in the appointment letter of the person designated as Ministerial Representative.

### 5. REMUNERATION

Experts will be remunerated in accordance with the offer for a brief that they have submitted. Any offer submitted shall not exceed the Auditor General Tariff fees as gazetted/ published from time to time. The offer for Ministerial Representatives is determined by the MEC and differs according to the size of the municipality.

### 6. CONTRACT CONDITIONS

If a particular brief requires a multi-disciplinary approach, experts on the panel of experts must form their own associations with other experts of the panel. Experts may not form associations with other experts who are not on the panel.

### 7. SKILLS, EXPERTISE AND EXPERIENCE REQUIRED

### Governance Experts (including individuals put forward by companies):

- (1) The individual/partner must demonstrate a minimum of 5 years' governance and administration experience in the local government field in leadership position(s) with clear and demonstrable experience as a local government practitioner.
- (2) Curriculum Vitae of proposed individual together with written references from municipalities and or copies of fixed term contracts of appointment.
- (3) In the case of companies the proposal document must, over and above the above CV or CVs, include specific details of projects undertaken within the municipal environment within the last three years.
