





FEEDBACK ON ENFORCEMENT & PROSECUTION MASTERCLASS

Compiled by Leslie Jacobs Inkosi Langalibalele Municipality Enforcement masterclass was held in Durban on 7/02/2019 hosted by Cogta & Milne.

Focus areas were;

- Enforcement of National building regulations and standards act 103 of 1977 as amended.
- Enforcement of Spluma and the town planning bylaw.
- Enforcement of building and other bylaws in this sector.
- Enforcement to prosecution in the magistrates court.

- Challenges faced by municipalities are;
- ▶ I.T. B (Ingonyama Trust Board) land.
- In instances of ITB land the local municipality is responsible of the developments on this land.
- Plans should be submitted to the local municipality for approval.
- Where possible contravention notices to be issued to the occupier of the land for illegal developments.
- Safety of Officials
- Political interference.
- Summons and warrants backlogged in courts.
- Fines do not deter offenders.
- Education of communities.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF ENFORCEMENT

In terms of the Criminal Procedure act 51 of 1977 (as amended)

- ▶ Issue a notice in terms of sect 4 of the CPA
- Monitor the situation.
- Serve summons Sect 56 for non -compliance.
- Monitor the situation.
- Adjudication in court.

Tariff approach

Municipalities may include illegal developments spot fine in their list of tariffs.

RATE CODE CHANGE APPROACH

- ► This may be used in the following instances;
- Abandoned buildings.
- Unauthorized illegal developments.
- Change of use of buildings without council consent.
- Where building, town planning and other bylaws have been contravened.
- The municipality changes the category of the illegal development by increasing the monthly rates in some instances by 7 times the normal monthly amount.
- This may only be done if there is been a change in section 11 in the rates policy, Credit control policy or building bylaw policy.
- ► This is a deterrent and will assist with ensuring compliance sooner.

Enforcement Officers

- Role of peace officer / enforcement officer.
- Appointed in terms of section 334 of the Criminal procedure Act 51 of 1977 (as amended)
- Peace officer to deliver contravention or summons.
- Preferably not a building or planning official.
- Effective form of inspection are a multi disciplinary approach.
- Carrying out inspection with SAPS, Planning, Building fire, and business licence departments.



Get your criminal record expunged.

- If you were convicted as an adult, they could assist you after 10 years. If you were convicted as a juvenile, they could assist you after 5 years.

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- Conclusion
- Most Municipalities have challenges with enforcement.
- Education and a multi disciplinary approach is the best approach.
