BACKGROUND/INTRODUCTION



- The Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013 (hereafter noted as SPLUMA) notes that as per Section 24 (1), "a Municipality must, after public consultation, adopt and approve a single land use scheme for its entire area within five years from the commencement of this Act".
- SPLUMA comes into effect on 01 July 2015, as per Government Gazette dated 27 May 2015. Specifically, this therefore implies that all 44 Local Municipalities will be required to have single Land Use Schemes by the 01 July 2020.



SPLUMA DEADLINE

- KZNCOGTA wrote to all local municipalities and metro in January 2019, way of a MEC Circular, requesting municipalities to confirm their statuses/progress based on our annual monitoring.
- In addition, municipalities were requested to confirm (in writing) that they
 will meet the SPLUMA deadline, or that they would require an exemption
 (inclusive of the additional time they require). Municipalities were further
 requested to submit workplans/action plans on how they would meet the
 SPLUMA deadline, or how they would phase/use the extended time, if
 approved.





SPLUMA DEADLINE

- It was noted that 22 out 44 municipalities have responded despite numerous requests.
- Of those that have responded:
 - 13 municipalities have confirmed they will meet the deadline, and do not require an exemption
 - 9 municipalities have confirmed that they will require an exemption
 - those requiring exemption have requested between 1-3 additional years to develop and adopt a single land use scheme.
- However, those that have requested exemption have not adequately addressed the requirements for application for exemption ito SPLUMA.





CURRENT SITUATION IN KZN: ADOPTED SCHEMES

- Since the inception of the erstwhile KwaZulu-Natal Planning and Development Act, No. 6 of 2008 (KZN PDA) and now the SPLUMA era:
 - only 12 municipalities (33,69%) have managed to adopt and put in place land use schemes
 - some with conditions such as Demarcation Issues, Rural Land Use Policy substitutions (Incremental introduction of Land Use Management and Reg) where there are challenges with Traditional Authorities and or Act 70 of 1970.
- These municipalities include uMzumbe LM, Newcastle LM, Danhauser LM, uMlalazi LM, Nkandla LM, KwaDukuza LM, Umzimkhulu LM, Okhlamba LM, Richmond LM, Ubuhlebezwe LM, Greater Kokstad LM and now uMhlabuyalingana (NEW)
- The uMshwathi LM has also noted a single land use scheme adoption. Awaiting confirmation Council Resolution

- The Department of Agriculture has a mandate for food security, however noting that land is a shared resource with various stakeholders.
- Therefore to balance the use the Department has embarked on a project, which is about delineating or Mapping agricultural land throughout the country to fulfil the mandate of the Department.
- Distinction between agricultural land and non agricultural land.





EVALUATION PRINCIPLES

- The distinction between low and potential agricultural land throughout the country.
- The intention is to release agricultural land to be in cooperated into the Municipal area. It was identified that there is a need for the growth of the municipal in all provinces due to the high population.
- Criteria followed during the assessment:
 - Land capability
 - Crop suitability
 - Protected Agricultural Areas
 - Land uses
 - Relevant, formal plans and decisions taken





PROCESS FLOW

- Interaction process consist of a series of interactions between DAFF, Municipality and the Executive Committee.
- The series occurs in a sequence of actions and reactions until the agricultural edge is drawn based on the need.
- Firstly DAFF liaise with the LM on intent of demarcation process
 - Requesting shape files and / or relevant spatial development data
- DAFF Conduct initial spatial assessment
 - Municipal land prior 1994, Guide plans /Town files, Gazettes on exclusions, Decisions taken i.t.o SALA committee.





PROCESS OUTCOME

- DAFF Provide maps and data to LM to identify discrepancies— misalignment/issues of concern based on the outcome of the initial spatial assessment
 - Agricultural edge
 - List of land parcels & erven
- Formal meeting between DAFF, executive committee of the Province as per SALA, LM and PDA to discuss proposals for consensus
- DAFF Publish Gazette for public comments
 - 30 days commenting period





PROCESS OUTCOME CONT..

- DAFF Evaluate and incorporate comments, where applicable
- Final meeting between DAFF, LM and PDA.
- Executive committee and DAFF meeting for recommendation
- Submission submitted to the Minister for sign off to formally Gazette the properties out of the provisions of SALA
- DAFF Gazette final areas of exclusion for implementation

NATIONAL SPLUM FORUM

NATIONAL SPLUM FORUM – 14 August 2019

- A recent court case: Greenpoint Ratepayers Association v City of Cape Town, regarding the composition of MPT Members may have significant implications on the implementation of SPLUMA across the country.
- Provinces are encouraged to raise matters (such as above) at the national forum to raise awareness etc.
- The Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development has recently commissioned a legal opinion on how the Minster is to deal with the SPLUMA deadline. Further detail to be communicated to provinces in due course.





NATIONAL SPLUM FORUM

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- The Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Chief
 Directorate is developing a Strategy to engage with Traditional
 Leaders on SPLUMA and Land Use Schemes. The Chief
 Directorate to keep provinces posted on the development and
 finalisation of the strategy.
