THE KZN PROVINCIAL SPATIAL DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK


The SPLUMA introduces a hierarchical system of SDFs.

The PSDF will present a provincial spatial development vision and programme.


It will guide the Provincial Executive in the execution of provincial executive powers pertaining to land development and use.

THE ECONOMY AND THE POPULATION

KZN is the second largest contributor to SA economy. The economy however faces a contraction of up to 6%, industry closures and job losses following the impact of COVID-19

KZN is the second most populous province in the country. And the population is likely to increase in size and density across the province especially in eThekwini.


ECONOMIC DISTRIBUTION AND RURAL POPULATION


The economy is driven by three main urban centres namely eThekwini, uMgungundlovu and King Cetshwayo.

% Contribution to KZN GVA











ECONOMIC GVA AND EMPLOYMENT

Tertiary sector making up about 74% of total GVA





Employment creation sectors:

agriculture, construction, catering and accommodation, government and community services




ECONOMIC PRODUCTION DISTRIBUTION








ECONOMIC VULNERABILITY







ECONOMIC CHALLENGES TO CONSIDER - 1

1. Rural economic development is more than agricultural development.

But how do we, through the PSDF:

- Diversify to other productive sectors
- Establish economic viable settlements and towns
- Capture the opportunities of land transformation
- Establish sustainable agri-hubs and farmer support systems
- 2. Migration patterns are a reality should we try and actively reverse the trends?
 - Settlement to town and rural to urban migrations
- 3. Grow existing and new dynamic and sustainable nodes?
- 4. Incentivize small and emerging businesses including the informal sector?

ECONOMIC CHALLENGES TO CONSIDER -2

How do we through the PSDF:

- 1. Promote manufacturing centres of excellence?
- 2. Build out our logistics, harbours, airports, roads and rail?
- 3. Provide infrastructure: water, electricity and basic services?
- 4. Up-skill the population to partake in the trade, financial and services sectors?
- 5. Support the changes in tourism markets?
- 6. Create a SMART Province through new technologies, 4 and 5th IR?
- 7. Reformat historic economics into new Green and Blue economies?
- 8. Account for global economic influences and investments?
- 9. Impact of COVID-19 on the economy?


